*Zadar is a city monument, surrounded by historical ramparts, a treasury of the archaeological and monumental riches of ancient and medieval times, Renaissance and many contemporary architectural achievements such as the first Sea Organ in the world. In addition to its historic old town center, Zadar boasts splendid medieval churches and Roman ruins, including the famous Church of St. Donat built on the site of the former ancient Roman forum. The Promenade, which runs down Obala Kralja Petra Kresimira IV, is also perfect for a gentle stroll as you soak up the surroundings, while tourists seeking sun and sand are spoiled for choice with Zadar's beautiful beaches.*

Protected as a Nature Park, it captivates visitors with a mix of tranquil beaches, steep cliffs, dense pine forests, and Mediterranean meadows. Highlights include a unique natural harbor with 25 small beaches, cliffs rising up to 161 m, and the healing saltwater lake "Mir." It's the perfect destination for nature lovers, hiking, diving, and relaxing in pristine surroundings.*

*Dedicated to a single masterpiece, the Museum of Apoxyomenos showcases the perfectly preserved bronze statue of a young athlete, discovered in 1997 off Lošinj. Dating to the 2nd–1st century B.C., the statue depicts the moment an athlete cleans himself after exercise. Housed in the Kvarner Palace since 2016, this unique exhibit highlights the timeless beauty and fascinating story of Lošinj's iconic Apoxyomenos.*

*The largest town on Lošinj Island, Mali Lošinj is a charming coastal town set around a natural harbor, known for its 19th-century sea-captains' houses, lush Mediterranean hills, and vibrant maritime history. Highlights include Čikat Bay, the Apoxyomenos Museum, historic churches, and scenic waterfront promenades, making it perfect for sightseeing, relaxation, and cultural exploration.*

## Day 6 Lošinj – Susak – Lošinj

Olive groves around the town produce the famous Cres olive oil. Explore the old town with its narrow streets, historic squares, and the city loggia, once a center of trade and public life. Cres has a long tourism tradition dating back to 1845 and today offers rich cultural, historical, and gastronomic experiences, making it one of Croatia's top destinations. Including olive oil tasting and wool workshop*
