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of the Adriatic Sea or the Pakleni Islands from elevated points on the island. This might involve a short uphill walk to a panoramic viewpoint, providing an excellent photo opportunity and a chance to appreciate the island's natural beauty.



Many tourists visit Croatia to explore the blissful Dalmatian islands, of which the most fashionable is Hvar. Here, trendy Hvar Town is home to some of the country's top hotels and best seafood restaurants. Dating back to the years spent under Venetian-rule (1420-1797), its car-free old town is made up of a spacious main square overlooked by a 16th-century cathedral, a pretty fishing harbor, and a hilltop fortress. Hvar Town is popular with yachters and celebrities, as well as travelers who come here to enjoy its beaches and watersports.

The big lure on Brac is its famous Zlatni Rat Bol beach, a rather amazing tongue-shaped beach that changes its shape with the tides! It's one of the most photographed beaches in the world—nude swimming on one end, with lots of yachts moored off shore and plenty of trees to find some shade. The water is luscious. Less frequent catamarans and ferries go directly to Bol and from the charming town it's just a 15 minute walk to the famous beach.

The island of Korčula is one of the greenest islands in the Adriatic Sea, with abundant vineyards and olive groves. Its southern coast is formed by small beaches and quiet coves. The Greeks, called the island Korkyra, Melaina or "black Corfu, all adjectives to define the wooded area. Korčula is located about 20km from the mainland between Makarska and Ston on Peljesac peninsula. Its south side is very rich in small beaches and over 200 caves. Currently it is home to some 3000 inhabitants. At the town of Korčula remains the essence of market town, with its mix of culture and its thick walls reminiscent of Dubrovnik. The city of Korčula appears as a typical medieval Dalmatian town, with towers and defense red-roofed houses. Marko Polo was born here in 1254. At the age of 17 he went on a long journey to China. Marko Polo was the first person who introduced Europe to the developed and powerful Chinese civilization and discovered many achievements, among which were pasta, paper money, oil as a mean of energy, many different spices and rich fabrics of different kinds and colors.
